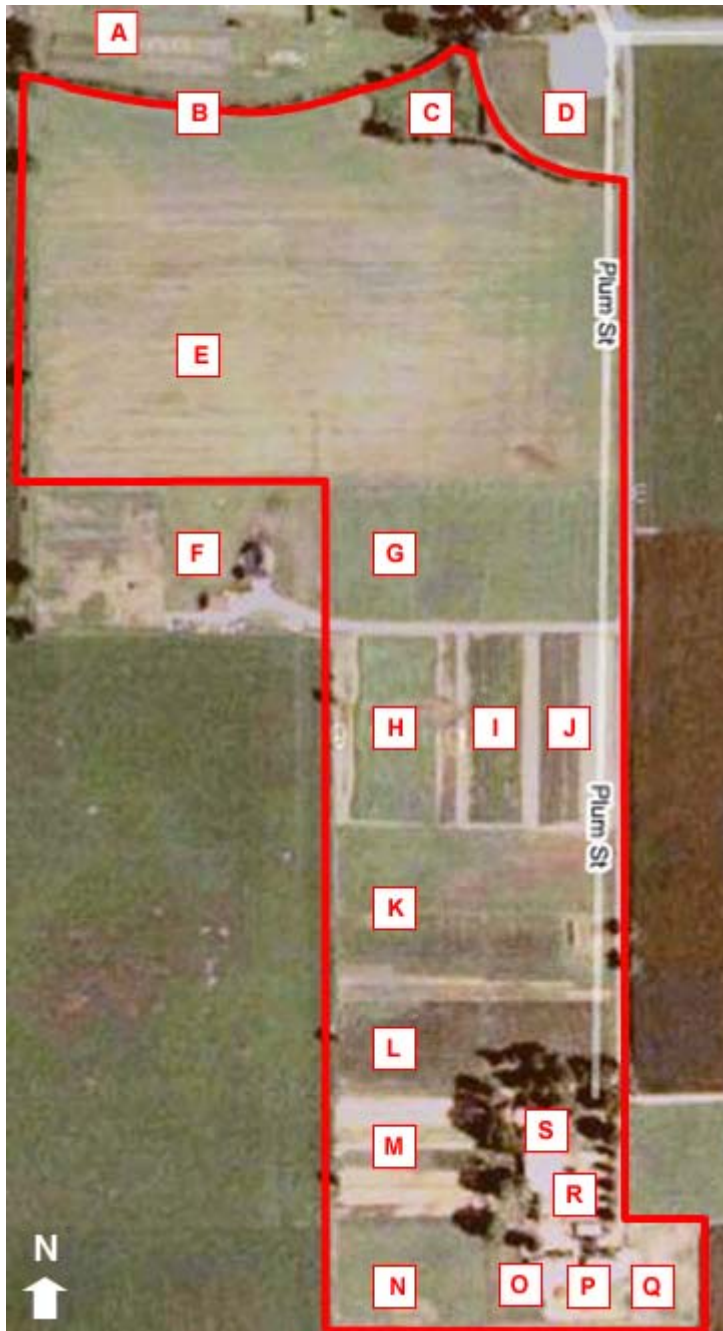

## Birds-eye view



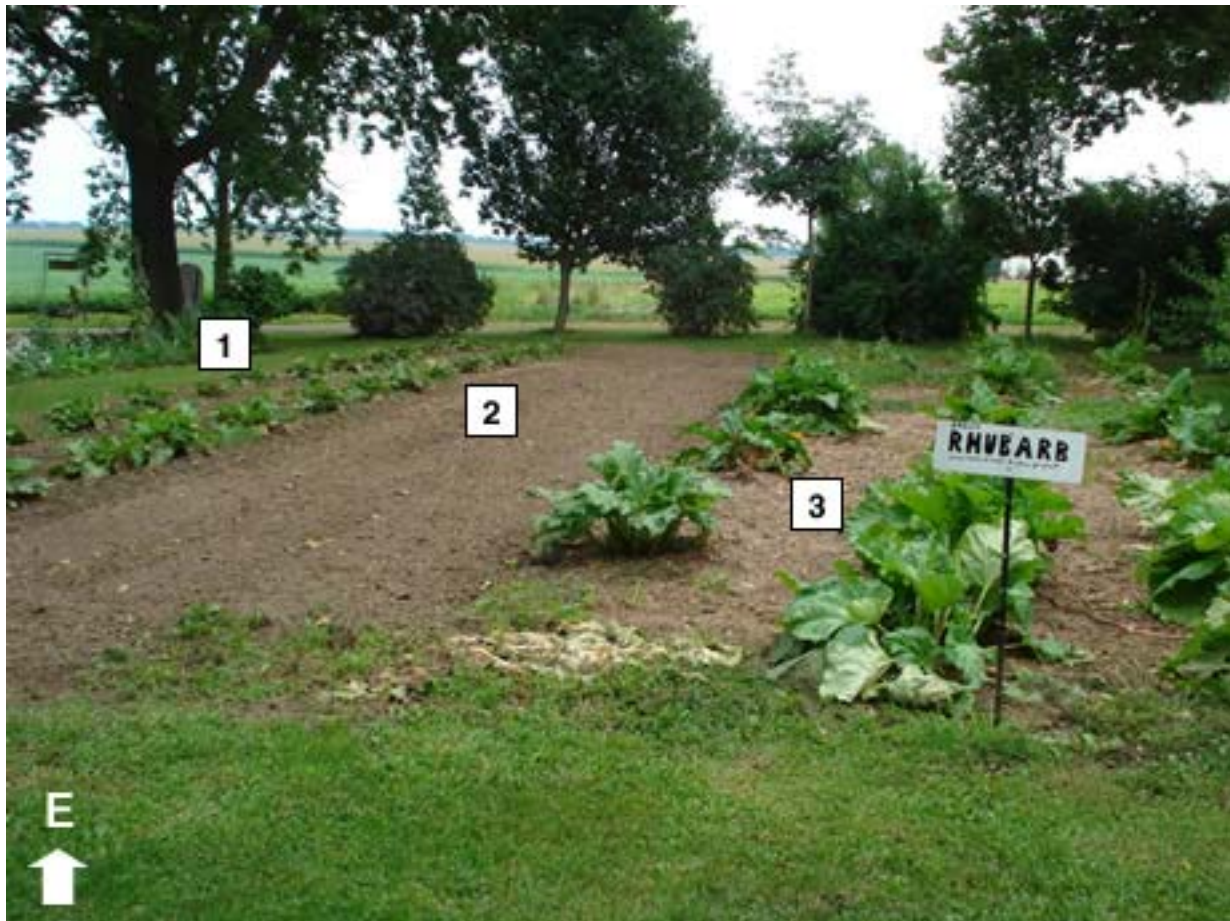

## Snip herbs

### Start at the north end of the herb garden...

Which also contains:

- Rhubarb
- Flowers and flowering shrubs
- Vegetables and onions
- Established gooseberries and currants – Popularity necessitated planting of new bushes in specialty berry garden
- Established dwarf sour pie cherry trees – Popularity necessitated planting of a new cherry orchard in 2007



1. Rhubarb – One of two preferred varieties
2. Cilantro – In the process of reseeded for a second crop
3. Another rhubarb variety – It bolts, which is why it's not preferred! ;-)

To the left: Wiegelas and rhubarb

In the distance: Main blueberry field

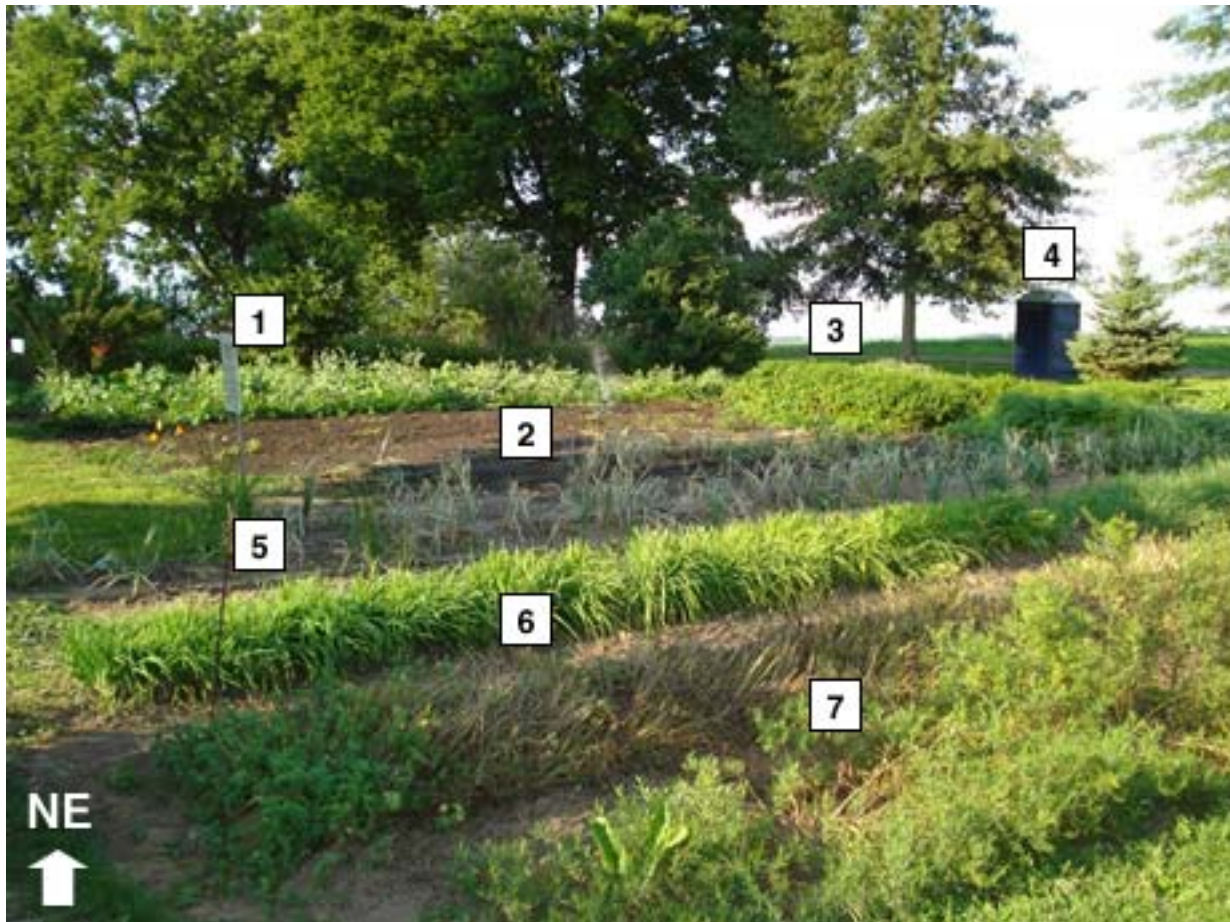
**...and work your way down...**

To the right of the picking shed: New picnic area

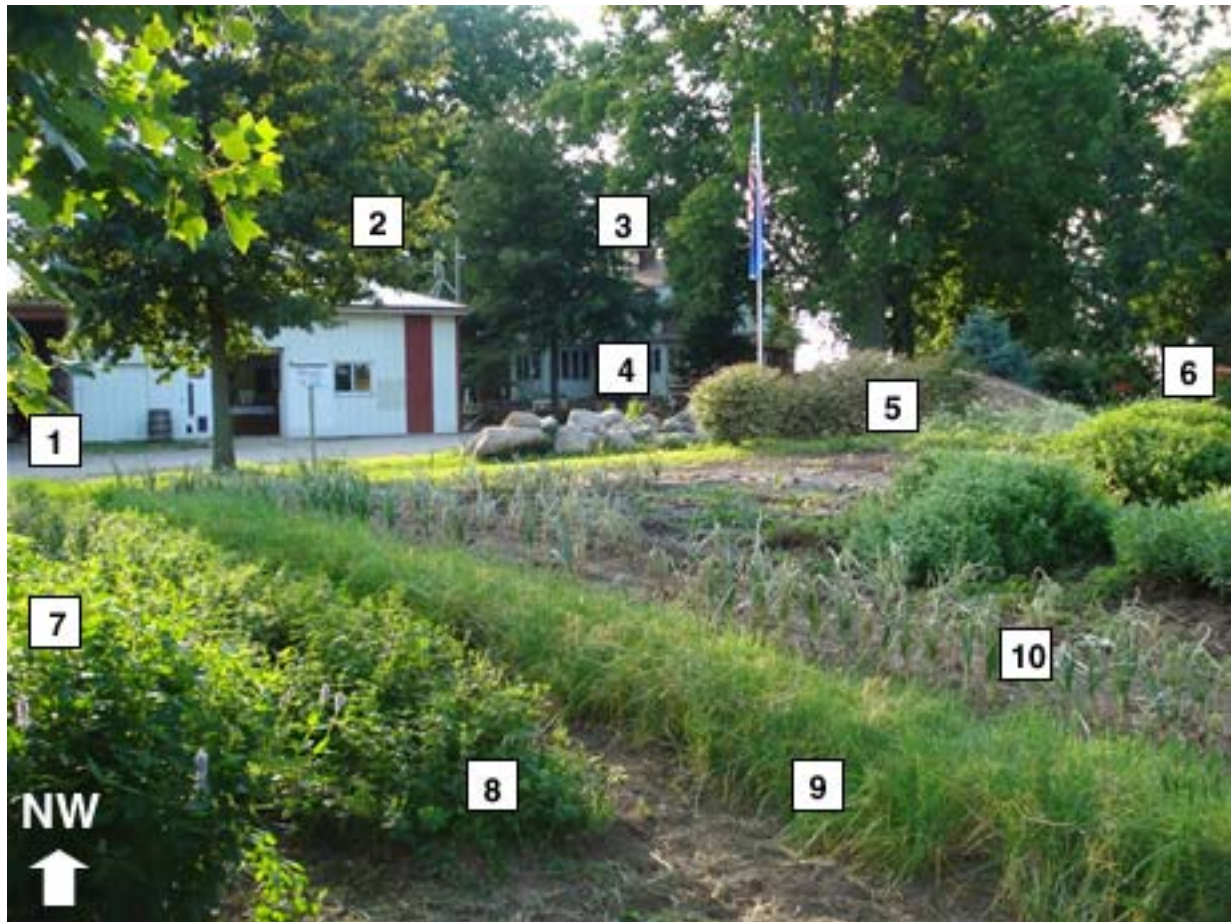
**...and work your way down...**

To the left: Circle drive and main parking area

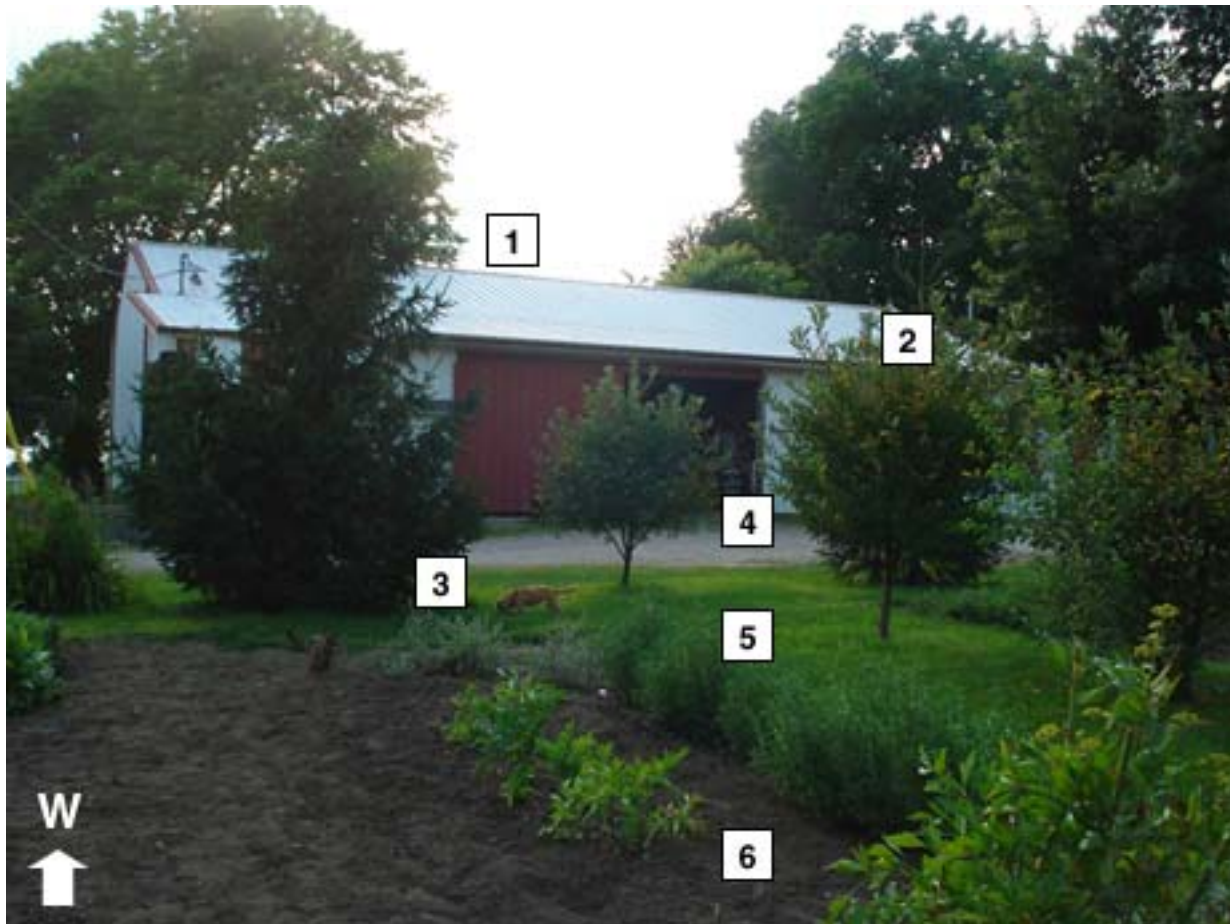
**...and work your way down...**
